FROM THE VICE PRESIDENT

Buff Chinas

Several years ago I told Cheri I wanted to develop Buff Chinas. At the time I was unaware there were already people working on them. About 8 years ago I purchased some pairs of Brown Chinas from Rodney and Cody Haefs up in Minn. I sold them to a friend in Iowa who then sold them to a friend here in Wis.

A couple of years later I got a call from the friend here in Wis. wanting to know what this goose was. He sent me some pictures and it was a Buff China hen. Unfortunately, something got it as it disappeared, but I realized that the Haefs were working on the Buff Chinas. I contacted Cody asking him about them working on the Buffs. Cody used a real small Buff African hen with a Brown China gander to start them. The young ganders would be splits, genetically the same as Buff/Brown Africans or Gray/Buff Toulouse splits. Taking a split gander back onto brown hens you should get about 1/2 of the young hens to be buff.

Once we put split ganders onto the buff hens we started to get buff ganders. I got a buff hen from Cody and crossed her with my brown gander to get splits, The next year I put a split gander on the buff hen and I got 3 buff hens. The next breeding season split ganders were again used on the buff hens and I got about 15 young buffs including 3 ganders.

In talking to Cody I learned that Curtis Oakes was also working on the Buff Chinas. I contacted Curtis and we traded some buffs. The gander from Curtis was crossed with a couple of my hens and some nice looking buffs came out. This last year using 3 buff ganders and 2 splits I hatched 55 buffs. I am going into this year with 6 buff ganders and 11 hens for my breeding flock. Will not be using any splits this year.





With the Arican in the background, we have gotten a few young that tend to be on the large size, couple show a little dewlap or lobes underneath. Like any buff bird the sun can bleach out their color if they are exposed to a lot of sun. There are a lot of buffs that do show great type and color.

There are several people now raising the Buff Chinas here in Wis.There are also people out east that have started raising them. Hopefully more will start raising them and we can get them into the standard. That process is just starting to get them into the standard.

There were Buff Chinas being shown at some shows the last couple of years; Columbus, Wi. International, Beaver Dam, Minn. State show that I attended.



Alberta Poultry Breeders Association is very excited to be hosting the 2024 IWBA Canadian National Meet at the Wild Rose Classic show in Olds, Alberta. This meet will accompany the 2024 APA Canadian National meet. When big meets like this are held, the show is well supported by exhibitors from all over Western Canada and it is easily accessible to exhibitors from the Pacific Northwest, Rocky Mountain Region and Upper Midwest.

Historically, waterfowl from all recognized classes make up about 1/3rd of the show. Strong contingents of bantam ducks, light ducks, medium ducks and geese are consistently exhibited by local exhibitors. We ensure that waterfowl are exhibited to their best advantage with all ducks elevated on tables alongside the chickens, all single deck cooping, ring judging of runners and excellent lighting to ensure that colour of Indies, Cayugas and other highly iridescent breeds and varieties can be fully evaluated. We are committed to hiring judges well versed in waterfowl and in sufficient numbers to ensure that all birds are adequately evaluated.

The town of Olds is easily accessible with connections to major highways in all directions, and only 30 mins from a major international airport in Calgary. The organizing committee is able to assist with shipped birds from across Canada, and can assist interested



American exhibitors with a clear understanding of the requirements and process necessary for bringing birds up to their friendly northern neighbour. We are looking forward to deep and diverse waterfowl classes and are excited to welcome many IWBA members to our beautiful province of Alberta.



Shows nominated should have a 2 year show record of 15 geese and 50 ducks (junior bird numbers count towards this).

Bid forms can be found on the website or contact Val for the form. They may be submitted by paper or electronic transfer.

Bids MUST be received by September 3rd, 2024.

REQUIREMENTS FOR POINT ACCUMULATIONS SHOW QUALIFICATIONS

(Modified January 2017 -see by-laws)

*A minimum of 65 waterfowl are required for the show (includes junior birds)

*A minimum of 50 ducks to include bantam and/or standard

- *A minimum of 15 geese
- *Runners to be shown in a ring

**Shows are encouraged to submit their show reports within 30 days

***The point tabulation official WILL NOT chase down reports. IT IS THE SHOW CHAIRMANS RESPONSIBILITY TO SUBMIT THE REPORTS TO IWBA PERSONNEL.

EXHIBITORS QUALIFICATIONS

- *A minimum of 2 exhibitors
- *A minimum of 6 birds in the breed
- **However a bird winning its weight class will accumulate points even if it did not have required competition in its breed(applies to reserve as well).
- *IWBA members MAY take the responsibility of submitting the show report to the point tabulator. Show reports are available at the new website or by contacting the Secty/Tres.

Gerry Donnelly


2023 IWBA Hall of Fame Inductee

It is with both great sadness and great pride that I am writing today about the life of my good friend, Gerry Donnelly. Known as one of Canada's premier waterfowl breeders and judges, Gerry was indeed a giant in the hobby we all love. Gerry had been breeding and showing waterfowl and poultry for close to seven decades. His first birds were shown at the Canadian National Exhibition, three ganders he once told me. One was a Toulouse, something that would develop into his most prized breed, one was an African, and the third a Canada goose. After that he was indeed hooked and over the years his collection of birds included every standard bred goose, duck, and turkey, as well as numerous breeds of chickens.

In his professional life, Gerald was an elementary school teacher and administrator for 35 years. He lived in Caledon East with his incredibly supportive wife, Joan. Gerry often mentioned that without the support of Joan and their nephew Jeff Weir and his sons Lowell and Cale that he would not possibly be able to look after all the stock held at Donnyweir Farm.

Last year Gerry was celebrated in an article in the publication The Livestock Conservancy, an article written by Cathy R. Payne, and entitled "A Master Breeder's Master Poultry Breeder." The article has several quotes from Gerry, but one that I have heard many times over the years, and which resonates greatly with me is "you need to know what the breed was developed for and what the bird is supposed to look like. Reading the Standard of Perfection helps, but talking to knowledgeable breeders, and seeing exemplary stock, is how you really learn." Over the years I have had the benefit of Gerry's knowledge and wisdom on too many topics to count, something that I will always cherish.





I first met Gerry and Joan at an Ontario Poultry Association meeting that was held at Donnyweir Farm. The year was 1986, and I continued to visit with them at least once every year, my last visit being this past August. I never stopped being amazed at the incredible surroundings of the farm with its series of connected ponds and stream beds that were lined with breeding pens, so all the geese had access to water. Gerry once told me that his mentor, Henry K Miller, had the most extraordinary farm in Pennsylvania, and that he was so inspired by this set up that he wanted to replicate it at his own farm. He would often reminisce saying that visiting Henry's "Blue Stream Farm" was like visiting a giant poultry show.

Gerry always spoke with such passion and enthusiasm about his waterfowl pursuits. The week before he passed, he was busy making arrangements for me to bring White Chinese Geese back from Nova Scotia. He said, and I quote: "Mark, I need these like a hole in the head, but when they are that good it is hard to say no."

Gerry was born and raised around commercial flocks of chickens and turkeys, with both his mother and grandmother raising birds. He also had a love of sheep and heritage Shorthorn beef cattle. It was this upbringing that developed Gerry's understanding of the commercial importance of the breeds and the true link between commercial viability and farm animals raised for show.

Gerry was constantly expanding and improving his lines of waterfowl and made trips to Europe where he sourced and arranged for importation of valuable genetics that were not available here in Canada or the United States. Gerry imported Aylesbury ducks from the UK in 1969, with successive imports every few years of Toulouse, Embdens, Saddlebacks, Romans, and Steinbachers. He also imported some tremendous Grey Saddlebacks and Toulouse from Germany.

In 2012, at the Canadian National APA Show, Gerry was recognized by the American Poultry Association for his significant contributions to the hobby. It was also at this show that he was awarded Show Champion on a magnificent Aylesbury old drake, two accomplishments he was extremely proud of.

Gerry was also instrumental in preserving the Beltsville Small White turkeys here in Canada. He had a trio of exceptional birds from Franklin Albertson, and with the help of the late Dan P. Jones, Secretary of Rare Breeds Canada, made arrangements to rescue the remaining genetics that were about to be exterminated from the facilities at the University of Guelph. Gerry wrote letters, made phone calls, and even got a Member of Parliament involved before half the flock was turned over to his care. When he received the birds, Gerry would recall that "half of them were old enough to vote." The other problem was they had been habitually artificially inseminated, but with perseverance he was able to cross the two lines and secure

the future of the breed. His goal was to then get them into the hands of others, and he managed to spread these important genetics from coast to coast. Gillian Jenkinson is one of those breeders who continues to work with these genetics, and during a recent discussion she offered the following: "If it was not for Gerry I would not have my lovely Beltsvilles. When I had the chance to gift him a Jake last year at Ontario Poultry Breeders, we both had tears in our eyes as he said the Jake looked like one of his originals from Guelph."

Frank Reese, a fourth-generation poultry breeder and founder of Good Shepherd Poultry Ranch, had this to say about Gerry: "Gerald was a lifelong friend whom I will miss daily. We chatted regularly and continuously encouraged each other to be the best breeders of poultry that we could be. Gerald understood not only the importance of exhibition qualities but also of marketability. I considered Gerald not only the best waterfowl judge in North America, but also a great waterfowl historian. What I will miss the most is talking about poultry history and reminiscing about great breeders from our past, those who shaped our knowledge and who were our mentors."

I had the good fortune of knowing Gerry for over thirty years and have wonderful memories of traveling to shows together and across Canada buying birds and visiting breeders. I accompanied Gerry numerous times to Gordon Ridler's and Murray Mitchell's, two very good friends and mentors of us both. We had a wonderful time visiting Prince Edward Island a few years back and had an opportunity to judge birds there together. Gerry had a tremendous intellect and was always a pleasure to talk to about topics beyond our hobby as well. I loved listening to him relive stories, always embellished and with a certain exaggerated flair that was part of his manner. We shared many interests and never stopped talking from the time we got together until it was time to leave. I miss these moments and although I will never be okay with the fact that I will not see him again, I am ever so grateful and proud to have been his friend. -Mark Camilleri
